From the 1930s through the 1960s, alumni and administrators Leonard and Gladys Crawford were among the most beloved figures on Tech's campus. The Crawfords were leaders in school spirit and campus life. Decades later, generations of alumni remember them with fondness.

Their children, Dr. Leonard Crawford, Jr. (1963) and Mrs. Sandra Crawford Chisolm (1964), were also Tech graduates. In honor of this family's legacy and Tech Pride, and in recognition of an estate gift from Dr. Leonard Crawford, Jr., the University's Alumni Center was dedicated as The Leonard and Gladys Crawford Alumni Center on April 6, 2017.

Today, the Crawford Alumni Center's mission is to cultivate campus traditions and perpetuate a passion for a life-long involvement between alumni and their alma mater and educate all on the value of investing in Tech.

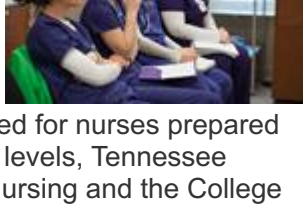

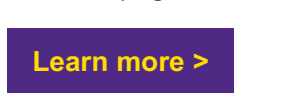
New Tennessee Tech Alumni Directory
